
Music Today

As We Gather: Throughout the Bible, ashes have been associated with humility, repentance, and mortality. In Genesis, we read of the great patriarch: "Abraham answered and said, 'Behold, I have undertaken to speak to the Lord, I who am but dust and ashes'" (Genesis 18:27). In Job, we read that the long-suffering Job said of his life: "I have become like dust and ashes" (Job 30:19b). Daniel the prophet states: "Then I turned my face to the Lord God, seeking Him by prayer and pleas for mercy with fasting and sackcloth and ashes" (Daniel 9:3). Ash Wednesday brings us the opportunity to follow the pattern set by our spiritual ancestors and to begin the observance of "a holy Lent" as we come before the Lord in ashes.

Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful,
slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster.

"In a favorable time I listened to you,

and in a day of salvation I have helped you."



Imposition of Ashes Genesis 3:19

Pastor: Dear brothers and sisters of our Lord Jesus Christ, on this day the Church begins a holy season of prayerful and penitential reflection. Our attention is especially directed to the holy suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. From ancient times the season of Lent has been kept as a time of special devotion, self-denial, and humble repentance born of a faithful heart that dwells confidently on His Word and draws from it life and hope.

Our Almighty and everlasting God spoke to Adam and Eve in the garden and said, "You are dust, and to dust you shall return." Your people of ancient times wore sackcloth and ashes as a sign of repentance. We remember our sinfulness through the ashes and remember the gracious gift of forgiveness through the cross of Jesus Christ, our Savior.

We now bring our humble offerings to our dear Father in heaven, and receive the sign of His Cross, remembering our baptisms, and the manner in which we were given the privilege to be called children of God.

Offering Ashes

Offerings may be brought up and collected at the base of the altar. Those who wish to receive the mark of ashes upon their forehead may come forward. The ashes are an ancient sign of mortality and death, sorrow and forgiveness, used at the beginning of Lent. As the ashes are imposed on the forehead of each person in the sign of the cross, the pastor says, "Remember that you are dust, to dust you shall return, and from dust you shall rise."


